Dear 4-H Families and Friends:

Happy 2019 and Best Wishes for a healthy and productive year ahead!! A new year brings a new opportunity to learn and grow through 4-H!! Thanks to all the volunteers who met at our committee meetings in November to plan the educational calendar for 2019, your work is most appreciated and makes our program strong. Be sure to read the "Clover Connection" from cover to cover so you do not miss important information and deadlines!! This month I want to highlight the importance of project meetings in the 4-H experience.

January is Project Meeting Focus Month:

Project Meetings are an Important Part of the 4-H Experience for Youth!

Project meetings are an important component of the educational experience for 4-H kids. Adult and older youth leaders enhance learning for members through sharing their knowledge and experiences. Meetings can be scheduled throughout the year, and the number will vary depending upon the project area and what you are wanting to accomplish. Winter months can be a good time to bring kids together for fun and learning. Members' interest is most ready to learn when they are signing up for projects and when they get their project literature. Club organizational leaders should let project leaders know which projects club members are enrolled in early in the year.

Let members know the meeting schedule as far in advance as possible. Here are some tips for successful meetings:

- Find out what the <u>members want to learn and accomplish</u> in their projects. (The literature can be an excellent source for ideas.)
- Review any safety measures that members will need to follow upfront.
- Do an introductory activity related to the project so that members get to know one another.
- Have something for the members to complete at the meeting and take home.
- Talk about what supplies will be needed and how the project meeting supplies will be paid for upfront.
- Assess when members are available for additional meetings, and the number of meetings they want. Ask
 members or parents to bring calendars to aid decisions.
- Encourage parents to participate in meetings.

If you are leading beginning level projects, ask older members in the project to help you. This is a great leadership experience for them! Parents are another excellent source of help. Don't hesitate to ask them to stay for the meeting and be actively involved in their child's project work. We all have talents to share with youth. Sharing knowledge and making the experience fun will encourage youth to continue to come back to the next meeting. Above all, make sure the learning experience is fun!

Becoming a 4-H Volunteer

4-H Volunteers are valued partners in working with our youth and help make 4-H possible. In order to volunteer, previous 4-H Youth Development experience is *not* necessary. The most important qualification is a desire to work with young people and help them grow through educational experiences and gain positive life skills. Please consider sharing your time and talents!

Adult volunteers working together with youth make a difference in the lives of young people. Volunteers work with UW-Extension professionals to develop the life skills of youth members, thus benefiting the state, employers, and the economy. Volunteers extend the resources of UW-Extension as they work with staff to deliver educational programs. Volunteering is a privilege.

How does one become a volunteer?

If you have not already done so, go to Wisconsin 4HOnline and create a family profile. Instructions can be found on the http://polk.uwex.edu website under the 4H enrollment tab. If your family is already in the system, *do not* create a new family profile, just make sure you are entered into your

family account and check that you want to be a 4-H volunteer. A background check will be conducted on you by the state and you will be contacted by GIS through e-mail requesting additional information needed in order for the state to conduct the background check and begin your Volunteer in Preparation (VIP) process.

Another step in the process, you can take the Online Mandated Reporter Training for 4-H Volunteers. Please see the informational sheet included in the December 2018 Clover Connection or visit the http://polk.uwex.edu website. You can also contact the Polk County Extension Office at 715.485.8600 for assistance.

Once the background check is successfully completed and you have completed the Online Mandated Reporter Training for 4-H Volunteers, there is one more important step in the process; taking the Volunteer in Preparation (VIP) Training! Trainings will be offered at the Polk County Government Center on the following dates and times:



Host Families Sought for 4H International Programs

It is not too early to be thinking ahead to next summer. Families are needed to host International exchange students, ages 12 to 18, for four weeks next summer as part of an exchange program sponsored by 4-H.

The program is open to 4-H & Non- 4-H families living in Wisconsin with children between the ages of 10 and 18. Families without children in this age range can be considered as hosts for the adult chaperones for two-week periods. You only need a willingness to share your home and your world. There is no need to know the language. The students have all studied English and are anxious to use it.

The 4-H States Exchange program is one of the largest exchange programs in the world. Since it began in 1972, some 45,000 students have stayed with families in 51 states and provinces including Wisconsin and more than 7,000 American students have made reciprocal visits to Japan & other participating countries. "The program gives host families a chance to share their culture, friendship and family life with an exchange student and at the same time learn about Japanese or South Korean everyday life," said Kay Hobler, retired Wisconsin 4-H Outreach Specialist. "The home-stays only last a month during summer vacation, but the effects last a lifetime."

2019 Wisconsin 4-H Dairy Quiz Bowl

The 2019 Wisconsin 4-H Dairy Quiz Bowl will be held on Saturday, February 9, 2019 at the Sewell Social Sciences Hall on the UW-Madison Campus. The Wisconsin 4-H Dairy Quiz Bowl encourages 4-H members to develop a more complete knowledge of dairy animals and related subjects. This contest is designed to provide an educational dairy experience for all 4-H Dairy project members, including those who may not own a dairy project animal while also providing opportunities for 4-H members to develop alertness and self-confidence. The Dairy Bowl is a "quiz bowl" competition where all questions focus on dairy topics. Teams of four 4-H members compete with each other in giving oral answers to questions posed by a moderator. Teams receive points for correct answers and may lose points for incorrect answers. The team with the highest final score is the winner. The registration deadline is January 18, 2019 and there is a \$20 fee per team.
