As kids and families prepare for the upcoming school year, it is also the time to prepare for another year as a 4-H member or leader. Re-enrollment is an important part of the process. J Everyone needs to re-enroll, even if you want to stay in the same projects. ALL enrollments and re-enrollments for leaders and members are done through 4HOnline. More information is included in this newsletter and will be available from your club organizational leader. The process is the same as last year. Just a reminder- youth have to enroll and be recognized as a member in a project in order to complete the project and EXHIBIT IN THAT PROJECT AREA AT THE COUNTY FAIR. Remember that as you fill out your on-line enrollment forms, as in the past, if you need assistance please contact the Extension Office.

The same holds true for being on a county committee; youth and adults have to sign up every year. You will find a form in this month's newsletter with all the county committees listed. Please complete and get back to our office by the end of October. The county committee structure and the volunteers who serve on these committees are the true strength of the Polk County 4-H program. Get involved in a committee today! *All adult committee members need to have completed the Volunteer Orientation process.*

National 4-H Week is October 6-12, and this year's theme is "INSPIRE KIDS TO DO!" This theme will give clubs a creative opportunity to highlight 4-H in their communities and schools. This is a wonderful time to showcase 4-H and bring new people into our program! Research has proven that participation in 4-H has a significant positive impact on young people. Recent findings from the Tufts University 0-H Study of Positive Youth Development indicate that, when compared to their peers, young people in 8-H are:

- Nearly 4 times more likely to contribute to their communities,
- Two times more likely to pursue healthy behaviors, and
- Two times more likely to engage in Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM) programs in the out-of-school time.

We welcome new families as they join 4-H this fall, and wish all the best to those who are graduating from the program or moving in other directions. Working together we can continue to provide positive, healthy, skill developing opportunities for Polk County youth.


4-H NATIONAL YOUTH SCIENCE DAY 2019 "GAME CHANGERS'

This October, 4-1-1 will launch the 2019 National Youth Science Day (NYSD) challenge, Game Changers. Designed by Google and West Virginia Extension service, Game Changers teaches kids ages 8-14 how to use computer science (CS) to create games, solve problems and engage with topics they're passionate about.

Game Changers uses physical activity and puzzles to teach kids important CS concepts and problem-solving skills, creating real-world connections between computer science and civic engagement, healthy living and agriculture. Although the challenge includes one computer-based and two unplugged activities to help kids learn CS, all can be completed without internet access.

New to NYSD? Teachers and facilitators don't need any prior experience with computer science or coding to bring Game Changers to their students. In this guide, you'll learn everything you need to know to facilitate the three Game Changers activities: "Pitch Your Passion", "Hack Your Harvest" and "Program Your Playground". You don't need prior experience with computer science or coding to bring Game Changers to your students. Activities are designed to make it easy for everyone, including teen teachers, to facilitate activities. Each activity includes background and preparation details for the facilitator, discussion points, prompting questions and reflection questions. Game Changers is perfect for first-time and beginner coders ranging in age from 8 to 14.

WELCOMING NEW MEMBERS & FAMILIES



Fall is a time of transitions for many 4-H Clubs. Some members graduate and some families may choose to try a new club or new experience. Other families have just learned about 4-H and have chosen your club for their 4-H involvement. Ensuring that these new families and members are welcomed into our clubs is everyone's responsibility. J

Most of us probably remember being new to a group. We probably felt excited to experience new things and meet new people. Often, we felt nervous and worried because we didn't completely understand what was going on. Sometimes, we feel this way for quite a while. We're going to focus on how we can welcome new members and their families by getting better acquainted and sharing information on how 4-H works. Here is an activity to try to welcome new members-

Activity: Across the Line

(Direct club members to stand on one side of the line. If there is enough space, include parents and volunteers. As an option you could have participants stand up and sit down instead of crossing a line.)

This is a get-to-know-you-better game. (Add or change questions to better fit the club). When I make a statement that applies to you, step over the line. Look around to see who has stepped across the line and who hasn't. After we're done with the statement, you will step back across the line before the next one. Step across the line . . .

- 1. If you like summer
- 2. If you're wearing red
- 3. If you ate breakfast this morning
- 4. If you've been in the 4-H club three or more years
- 5. If you like winter
- 6. If you have blue eyes
- 7. If you've been to 4-H camp
- 8. If you like mushrooms on pizza
- 9. If you're in the 4-H Foods project (or substitute a popular club project)
- 10. If you have a brother
- 11. If you are a dog person
- 12. If you play a sport
- 13. If you've given a talk in 4-H
- 14. If you've ever been to Washington, D.C.
- 15. If you've taken a project to the county fair
- 16. If you're in the 4-H Photography project (or another popular club project)

Did anyone learn something new about someone? How about something new about someone that you've known for a while?

All of us were new to 4-H at one time. We know that it seems like a lot to learn and it can be a bit overwhelming. Our goal is to have fun while learning new skills. It is not our goal to frustrate new people. So, experience 4 -H one season at a time. Ask questions. We're glad to have new members and families in our group! You make our club more fun and interesting!

In addition Ambassadors participate in community service and service learning project

- 5. The Polk County Ambassador Program is really about teamwork among teens to get all of the above tasks completed. Not every individual person is expected to come and help at all of these events but they should try and be at as many as possible.
- 6. Ambassadors are expected to attend regularly scheduled meetings and not to be mem bers in name only. Participation in this program is your opportunity to gain valuable ex perience about responsibility, commitment, and team work.
- 7. Ambassadors must be in seventh grade and 12 years old and can be members through grade 13(one year outside of high school).
- 8. Ambassadors will be given a 4-H Ambassador Shirt and 4-H name badge after selection. Ambassadors are expected to wear these at all 4-H events where they are serving in their public relation role as an Ambassador.
- 9. A team of Adult Advisors will work with the Ambassadors at meetings and events


