Why Wait To Re-enroll?? A reminder that 4-H enrollments and re-enrollments should be done now before the December 1 deadline (Information is available at <u>wi.4honline.com</u>.) The process of enrolling or re-enrolling is easy and information was shared with families at club meetings and can be viewed at <u>https://polk.extension.wisc.edu/</u> under 4-H enrollments. Club organizational leaders or "Club Managers" need to accept members and leaders after enrollment and then our office has to verify records. Adult volunteers must have completed the VIP Volunteers In Preparation Training and process for new volunteers in order to have their enrollments active. <u>Volunteer leaders must re-enroll each year in order to keep their 4-H volunteers in the on line system by December 1st, and projects can be added or changed up until April 15. KEEP THESE DEADLINES IN MIND.</u>

Many new families are now joining our program and we welcome them! We all need to work to ensure these new families feel welcome and have the information they need to succeed in 4-H and your help is appreciated. 4-H can seem complicated, with all the rules, terms, and deadlines. Maybe your family would be willing to mentor a new family that has joined your club and help them understand some of the ins and outs of the program. Make this a discussion at your next club meeting so that new families are getting the answers and help they need. 
<u>4-H NATIONAL YOUTH</u> <u>SCIENCE DAY 2019</u> <u>"GAME CHANGERS"</u>

This October, 4-1-1 will launch the 2019 National Youth Science Day (NYSD) challenge, Game Changers. Designed by Google and West Virginia Extension service, Game Changers teaches kids ages 8-14 how to use computer science (CS) to create games, solve problems and engage with topics they're passionate about.

Game Changers uses physical activity and puzzles to teach kids important CS concepts and problem-solving skills, creating real-world connections between computer science and civic engagement, healthy living and agriculture. Although the challenge includes one computer-based and two unplugged activities to help kids learn CS, all can be completed without internet access.

New to NYSD? Teachers and facilitators don't need any prior experience with computer science or coding to bring Game Changers to their students. In this guide, you'll learn everything you need to know to facilitate the three Game Changers activities: "Pitch Your Passion", "Hack Your Harvest" and "Program Your Playground". You don't need prior experience with computer science or coding to bring Game Changers to your students. Activities are designed to make it easy for everyone, including teen teachers, to facilitate activities. Each activity includes background and preparation details for the facilitator, discussion points, prompting questions and reflection questions. Game Changers is perfect for first-time and beginner coders ranging in age from 8 to 14.

Each module is about 7-10 minutes in length. You move through the modules at your own pace. It will take you about 30-45 minutes to complete all four modules.

CLUB MANAGERS & ORGANIZATIONAL LEADERS

If you are the club manager/organizational leader who is responsible for confirming your club members you must:

Follow the "4HOnline – Club Managers guidelines included with this newsletter in the club organizational packets.

1. Log in following directions using the password that is listed on the directions.

 Check your membership and make sure that each of your members is enrolled in the correct categories (such as: Cloverbuds – K-2 ONLY; Exploring – 3rd graders - (unless you are in 4-H for the first time as a 4th graders) – you would then also be an EXPLORER (if you are in 5th grade you must choose projects).

- 3. Delete old projects or check with your member – (if Exploring still shows up and your member is now a regular 4-H members – **delete exploring for the current year.)**
- 4. After you have gone through the membership then confirm each member/leader.

If you do not confirm your members at the club level, the county cannot confirm them in your club and they will not receive any mailings or newsletters until they are confirmed.

REMINDER – If you are changing clubs you cannot change them yourself – you MUST call Eileen at the Extension office at 715.485.8600 to have it changed.

 \cdot Section 5 – Discussion question – this is your thoughts and opinions about the topic being presented. There are no right or wrong answers. Describe your thoughts and your reasoning.

- · 4-H'er can apply for ME awards/experiences and not attend the interview date
- · Interviews typically improve a 4-Her in the ranking of ME awards/experiences
- · Prepare for your interview:

o Know the information on your ME Form and highlight areas of your 4-H success

o Be ready to share your experiences and growth in each project area

o Be ready to share how you have led and helped others through the project ar-

o Your project areas should show progression, change, and improvement over time.

Participants will get an opportunity at the workshop to learn more about what can be added to your M.E. and will get ideas on how to improve your own forms for future use.

These important forms are used for award trip selections and scholarship applications. These forms are used for selection to Citizenship Wash-ington Focus, National 4-H Congress, National 4-H Conference, and the highest Wisconsin 4-H honor award – the Key Award! In addition, these forms can be a great start on a resume for employment! The 4-H Awards Committee will meet after the interviews to select 2019-20 Polk County Award Trip winners from the applicants that evening.

EXPLORING PROJECT

If you are joining a 4-H club and you are in 3rd grade or if you are a 4th grader and joining 4-H for the first time you are considered an EXPLORER, and you should enroll in Exploring as your only project.

You can also enroll in another project or two, like Horse if you are planning on doing horse activities so that you can be included in horse event information. Exploring is set up that way for first year members so that they can "Explore" a wide variety of areas in 4-H so that the next year, you can enroll in those areas for projects. You are only an Explorer for one year. Exploring is just for that first year in grades 3 or 4.

BECOMING A 4-H VOLUNTEER







4-H Volunteers are valued partners in working with our youth and help make 4-H possible. In order to volunteer, previous 4-H Youth Development experience is **not** necessary. The most important qualification is a desire to work with young people and help them grow through educational experiences and gain positive life skills. Please consider sharing your time and talents!

Adult volunteers working together with youth make a difference in the lives of young people. Volunteers work with Extension professionals to develop the life skills of youth members, thus benefiting the state, employers, and



the economy. Volunteers extend the resources of Extension as they work with staff to deliver educational programs. Volunteering is a privilege.

How does one become a volunteer?

If you have not already done so, go to Wisconsin 4HOnline and create a family profile. Instructions can be found on the polk.extension.wisc.edu website under the 4H enrollment tab. If your family is already in the system, **do not** create a new family profile, just make sure you are entered into your family account and check that you want to be a 4-H volunteer. A background check will be conducted on you by the state **and you will be contacted by 4hvolunteers@ohr.wisc.edu through e-mail requesting additional information needed in order for the state to conduct the background check and begin your Volunteer in Preparation (VIP) process.**

Another step in the process, you can take the required **Online Mandated Reporter Training for 4-H Volunteers.** Please see the informational sheet included in this November 2019 Clover Connection or visit the **polk.uwex.edu website**. You can also contact the Polk County Extension Office at 715.485.8600 for assistance.

Once the background check is successfully completed and you have completed the Online Mandated Reporter Training for 4-H Volunteers, **there is one more important step in the process; taking the Volunteer in Preparation (VIP) Training!** Trainings will be offered at the Polk County Government Center on the following dates and times:

> Tuesday, December 10, 2019 at 6:30 p.m. Thursday, January 23, 2020 at 6:30 p.m. Tuesday, February 25, 2020 at 6:30 p.m. Thursday, April 16, 2020 at 6:30 p.m.
