We need to work to ensure these new families feel welcome and have the information they need to succeed in 4-H and your help is needed to assist these new members and families. 4-H can seem complicated, with all the rules, terms, and deadlines. 4-H NATIONAL YOUTH SCIENCE DAY 2019 "GAME CHANGERS"

This October, 4-1-1 will launch the 2019 National Youth Science Day (NYSD) challenge, Game Changers. Designed by Google and West Virginia Extension service, Game Changers teaches kids ages 8-14 how to use computer science (CS) to create games, solve problems and engage with topics they're passionate about.

Game Changers uses physical activity and puzzles to teach kids important CS concepts and problem-solving skills, creating real-world connections between computer science and civic engagement, healthy living and agriculture. Although the challenge includes one computer-based and two unplugged activities to help kids learn CS, all can be completed without internet access.

New to NYSD? Teachers and facilitators don't need any prior experience with computer science or coding to bring Game Changers to their students. In this guide, you'll learn everything you need to know to facilitate the three Game Changers activi-ties: "Pitch Your Passion", "Hack Your Harvest" and "Program Your Playground". You don't need prior experience with computer science or coding to bring Game Changers to your students. Activities are designed to make it easy for everyone, including teen teachers, to facilitate activities. Each activity includes background and preparation details for the facilitator, discussion points, prompting questions and reflection questions. Game Changers is perfect for firsttime and beginner coders ranging in age from 8 to 14.

CLUB MANAGERS AND ORGANIZATIONAL LEADERS

If you are the club manager/ organizational leader who is responsible for confirming your club members you must:

Follow the "4HOnline – Club Managers guidelines included with this newsletter in the club organizational packets.

- 1. Log in following directions using the password that is listed on the directions.
- Check your membership and make sure that each of your members is enrolled in the correct categories (such as: Cloverbuds - K-2 ONLY; Exploring - 3rd graders - (unless you are in 4-H for the first time as a 4th graders) you would then also be an EXPLOR-ER (if you are in 5th grade you must choose projects).
- 3. Delete old projects or check with your member – (if Exploring still shows up and your member is now a regular 4 -H members – **delete exploring for the current year.**)
- 4. After you have gone through the membership then confirm each member/leader.

If you do not confirm your members at the club level, the county cannot confirm them in your club and they will not receive any mailings or newsletters until they are confirmed.

REMINDER – If you are changing clubs you cannot change them yourself – you MUST call Eileen at the Extension office at 715.485.8600 to have it changed.





Belong, Mastery, Generosity and Independence are the 4 Essential Elements of Positive Youth Development that are focused online 4-H Youth Development.

Check out how you as an adult volunteer or youth leader can foster the development of these elements in the youth. You will have an opportunity to:

- Learn about each element in relation to different age youth from kindergarten to high school.
- Consider how you can develop life skills in youth
- Build on what you know to foster the growth of these elements in young people

Each module is about 7-10 minutes in length. You move through the modules at your own pace. It will take you about 30-45 minutes to complete all four modules.

EXPLORING **PROJECT FOR** FIRST YEAR **MEMBERS**

If you are joining a 4-H club and you are in 3rd grade or if you are a 4th grader and joining 4-H for the first time you are considered an EXPLOR-ER, and you should enroll in Exploring as your only project.

You can also enroll in another project or two, like Horse if you are planning on doing horse activities so that you can be included in horse event information. Exploring is set up that way for first year members so that they can "Explore" a wide variety of areas in 4-H so that the next year, you can enroll in those areas for projects. You are only an Explorer for one year. Exploring is just for that first year in grades 3 or 4.
