Dear 4-H Families and Friends:

Happy 2020 and Best Wishes for a healthy and productive year ahead!! A new decade and a new year brings opportunities to learn and grow through 4-H!! Thanks to all the volunteers who met at our committee meetings in November to plan the educational calendar for 2020, your work is most appreciated and makes our program strong. Be sure to read the "Clover Connection" from cover to cover so you do not miss important information and deadlines!! This month I want to highlight the importance of project meetings in the 4-H experience.

January is Project Meeting Focus Month:

Project Meetings are an Important Part of the 4-H Experience for Youth!

Project meetings are an important component of the educational experience for 4-H kids. Adult and older youth leaders enhance learning for members through sharing their knowledge and experiences. Meetings can be scheduled throughout the year, and the number will vary depending upon the project area and what you are wanting to accomplish. Winter months can be a good time to bring kids together for fun and learning. Members' interest and enthusiasm about a project is usually high shortly after project enrollment and when they get their project literature. Club organizational leaders should let project leaders know which projects club members are enrolled in early in the year. **Project leaders can be given access through 4honline to see enrolled members- contact the Extension office to be given this access.**

Let members know the meeting schedule as far in advance as possible. Here are some tips for successful meetings:

• Find out what the <u>members want to learn and accomplish</u> in their projects. *(The literature can be an excellent source for ideas.)*

- Review any safety measures that members will need to follow *upfront*.
- Do an introductory activity related to the project so that members get to know one another.
- Have something for the members to complete at the meeting and take home.
- Talk about what supplies will be needed and how the project meeting supplies will be paid for *up-front*.

• Assess when members are available for additional meetings, and the number of meetings they want. Ask members or parents to bring calendars to aid decisions. Encourage parents to participate in meetings.

If you are leading beginning level projects, ask older members in the project to help you. This is a great leadership experience for them! Parents are another excellent source of help. Don't hesitate to ask them to stay for the meeting and be actively involved in their child's project work. We all have talents to share with youth. Sharing knowledge and making the experience fun will encourage youth to continue to come back to the next meeting. Above all, make sure the learning experience is fun!

Interested in learning about livestock, want to have FUN, and compete at the same time then Livestock Quiz Bowl and Skill-a-thon are for you. Practices will be held on Sundays from 2-4 pm at the justice center in Balsam Lake. Snacks and drinks will be provided at the practices. Participants will also receive credit for their educational requirement for the Polk County Quality Meats project.

Competition in Quiz Bowl & Skillathon encourages members to develop a more complete knowledge of animals and related subjects. This contest provides an educational program for all project members, including those who may not own a project animal, and provides a way to develop selfconfidence. The contest will be divided into junior (grades 3-8), senior (grades Belong, Mastery, Generosity and Independence are the 4 Essential Elements of Positive Youth Development that are focused online 4-H Youth Development.



Would you like to learn more and how they relate to your role as a leader working with youth? Check out how you as an adult volunteer or youth leader can foster the development of these elements in the youth. You will have an opportunity to:

* Learn about each element in relation to different age youth from kindergarten to high school.

- * Consider how you can develop life skills in youth
- * Build on what you know to foster the growth of these elements in young people

Each module is about 7-10 minutes in length. You move through the modules at your own pace. It will take you about 30-45 minutes to complete all four modules.

CLUB MANAGERS & ORGANIZATIONAL LEADERS

If you are the club manager/organizational leader who is responsible for confirming your club members you must:

Follow the "4HOnline – Club Managers guidelines included with this newsletter in the club organizational packets.

- 1. Log in following directions using the password that is listed on the directions.
- Check your membership and make sure that each of your members is enrolled in the correct categories (such as: Cloverbuds – K-2 ONLY; Exploring – 3rd graders - (unless you are in 4-H for the first time as a 4th graders) – you would then also be an EXPLORER (if you are in 5th grade you must choose projects).
- 3. Delete old projects or check with your member (if Exploring still shows up and your member is now a regular 4-H members – **delete exploring for the current year.)**
- 4. After you have gone through the membership then confirm each member/leader.

If you do not confirm your members at the club level, the county cannot confirm them in your club and they will not receive any mailings or newsletters until they are confirmed.

REMINDER – If you are changing clubs you cannot change them yourself – you MUST call Eileen at the Extension office at 715.485.8600 to have it changed.

A background check will be conducted on you by the state and you will be contacted by 4hvolunteers@ohr.wisc.edu through email requesting additional information needed in order for the state to conduct the background check and begin your Volunteer in Preparation (VIP) process.

Another step in the process, you can take the required Online Mandated Reporter Training for 4**H** Volunteers. Please visit the

Once the background check is successfully completed and you have completed the Online Mandated Reporter Training for 4-H Volunteers, **there is one more** important step in the process; taking the Volun-teer in Preparation (VIP) Training! WI State 4-H Dairy Quiz Bowl is scheduled for April 4, 2020

(Madison) The 4-H Dairy Quiz Bowl Contest will be held on Saturday April 4, 2020 at UW Madison Animal Sciences Building, Madison, WI.

The Dairy Bowl is a "quiz bowl" competition where all questions deal with dairy topics. Competition in the 4-H Dairy Bowl encourages a 4-H member to develop a more complete knowledge of dairy animals and related subjects. This contest provides an educational dairy program for all dairy project members, including those who may not own a dairy project animal, and provides a way to develop alertness, self-confidence, teamwork skills, and mastery in the area of dairy science.

Teams of four members compete with each other in giving oral answers to questions posed by a moderator. Teams receive points for correct answers and may lose points for incorrect answers. The team with the highest final score is the winner.

Teams are divided into three age divisions and teams can consist of 3 or 4 members. The junior division are youth who are under 14 years of age as of Jan.1, 2020. The senior division are youth who are all 14 years of age or older as of Jan. 1, 2020. A mixed team must contain at least one youth from each age division.

The contest is organized on a double elimination basis with winning teams advancing into further rounds until a champion team emerges.

The cost is \$20 per team due at the time of registration.

Registration starts at 9 a.m., competitions start at 9:30 a.m.

Deadline for registration is March 14, 2020, 5 p.m.
