Next time you are planning an event or program with youth, think about ways you can take the learning beyond the activity and ask those im-


portant questions. Your guidance will take their learning to a whole new level!

FARM SAFETY & FARM MACHINERY CERTIFICATION COURSE SET

The Barron-Polk County Tractor Safety Certification Program will be held June 6, 7, 8 and 9th, 2022 at a Barron High School. The program runs from



8:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday of that week, and 8:00 am to 12:00 pm on Thursday. The costs \$20 per person.

Tractor Safety Certification is designed to meet both State and Federal re-

quirements for youth under 16 years old. The program covers 12-13 year olds operating tractors or self-propelled implements on public roads under direction of their parents or guardian or for work related to their family farm operation. The Tractor Safety Certification is also for youth who are 14 and 15 years old who will be employed (or working without pay) for someone other than their own family farm.

Youth attending the Tractor Safety Certification Program will learn how to safely operate a tractor, identify potentially hazardous situations and reduce the risk of injury in those situations.

Young people will be given the opportunity to practice their driving skills and safety understanding through "hands-on" learning. Each student must successfully and safely drive a tractor and 2-wheel implement through an obstacle course.

To successfully complete the Tractor Safety Certification Program youth must be at least 12 years old at the time of the course, attend 24 hours of instructional training, pass a written examination and successfully complete a practical driving exam which demonstrates tractor driving ability.

The 2022 Food Revue is Here!!

Attention 4-H'ers! Now is your chance to prepare a favorite food, have a one on one conference with a judge and have some FUN!

June 11th, 9am at St. Mary's Church, 1265 Ridgeway St., Hammond, WI 54015. Judging in the Foods Revue is based on the food, the menu, the table service and participants understanding of food preparation, time management, nutrition and cost

REGULATIONS FOR GRADES 4-13

- 1) Foods revue participants: If you entered the foods revue, you must enter this separately on your fair entry sheet.
- 2) Class P, Q, and R. Select one category, make a menu on a 3"x5" card and prepare one food from the menu.
- 3) Write the complete recipe on a 3"x5" card. Recipes must give specific amounts of ingredients (such as 3 cups chopped cabbage, NOT 1/2 small head of cabbage). Be sure to indicate the number of servings the recipe makes.
- 4) Prepare the table setting, centerpiece appropriate to the menu/occasion, and display completed food along with menu cards.
- 5) The menu you choose should contain at least one-third of the nutrients needed daily.
- 6) Teams shall consist of two members. If entering a team lot, entry needs to be added only on one team member's entry form. The entrant will be paid the premium. Team members are responsible for splitting their own premiums.

REGULATIONS FOR KINDERGARTEN-4TH GRADERS

- 1) Select a snack that you have especially enjoyed preparing this year. You may find a recipe in a cookbook or any other source. Send a copy of this recipe along with your entry blank.
- 2) Practice preparing the recipe until you have a good product each time.
- 3) Prepare one note card (3"x5") with the recipe and bring it the day of the show.
- 4) Prepare the food at home. If facilities available, warming and final prep may be completed at Revue.
- 5) Bring one serving on a plate or in a glass or other appropriate serving container.
- 6) Lower Elementary exhibitors may bring a table setting and/or centerpiece, but will not be judged on those items. Higher Elementary exhibitors should prepare a table setting and centerpiece appropriate to food item. These items will be part of the judging, but the main focus is on food and preparation.
- 7) The judge will talk with you. Be prepared to explain to the judge how you prepared the food. Examples of questions you might be asked are: In preparing this food item, what would you prepare first? Last? Does your food item need to be refrigerated to keep it safe?

YOU MUST BE ENTERED IN THE FOOD PROJECT TO BE IN THE FOODS REVUE!

Please bring a recipe card that will remain at the revue. Participants will dish one serving of their entry onto their table setting for the judging process. Keep the cold items cold and the hot items hot! All participants can vote on the best table setting to go along with the food entry. A tasting table will be available so others can taste your entry so

Judging at the Run-Off will be based on the following: Robot completes the challenge on the first try = 30 points. Robot does a portion of the challenge on the first try = 10 points and completes the challenge on the second try (add 15 points) for a total of 25 points. Robot does a portion of the challenge on the first try = 10 points and requires second and third try to complete the challenge (add 10 points) for a total of 20 points. If Robot cannot complete the challenge after third, try 15 points total will be awarded.





