BECOME A 4-H VOLUNTEER!

Volunteers help make 4-H possible.

To volunteer, you don't need to have previous experience working with youth. The most important qualifications are:

- •A desire to work with young people to help them learn new things and gain life skills; and
- •Wanting to provide youth with positive experiences in a safe and welcoming environment.

If you are 18 years or older and interested in becoming a 4-H volunteer, we can help. We will provide new volunteers with <u>Volunteers in Preparation Training</u> about how to work effectively with youth and what resources are available to volunteers. We will also ask you to participate in a <u>Mandated Reporter Training</u> & <u>Title IX Training</u> to learn more about how to protect youth from child abuse and neglect. Finally, to ensure the safety of all youth and volunteers, a <u>Volunteer Behavior Expectations</u> <u>Agreement</u> and background check are required.

Depending on their role, some volunteers may be asked to complete subject matter specific trainings as well as training to enrich their knowledge of youth development (for example chaperones or Shooting Sports leaders).

All volunteers, both new and returning, are also required to take training on how to report sexual misconduct. Answers to questions about reporting and training <u>are available on our FAQ page</u>.

The committee meetings this year should hold the purpose of helping to develop educational opportunities for youth to expand their skills and knowledge, rather than focusing more solely on the changes needing to be made to the Polk County Fairbook. Do you have a special skill you would be willing to share? Bring it up! Can't make the meeting, let me know and we can work together to find a time to plan.

Polk County 4-H depends on the volunteers that make this a successful program. Each person brings a new perspective and knowledge that helps youth to grow. If you are interested in becoming a volunteer and helping in any capacity, please contact me and I will help you get involved. There are several components to becoming a volunteer that 4-H takes to ensure each volunteer is supported in their role, as well as working to keep our youth safe.

- Background checks completed every 4 years (every 2 years for those who serve as overnight chaperones)
- Mandated reporter training
- Volunteer in Preparation Training (only need to do one time)
- Title IX training (yearly)

Additionally, we offer a yearly leader training. At least one volunteer from every club must complete this training in order for your club to continue being chartered. This year we will offer two in person trainings, December 3rd and 10th. You only need to attend one training as they will both offer the same topics. More details can be found in this month's Clover Connection.

Without volunteers, there would be no way to continue doing this amazing work for our youth. Thank you for all that you do to contribute to the success of our 4-H program!
