

FAIR ENTRY REMINDERS!

All entries, regardless of when they are judged, are to be brought to the fairgrounds no earlier that 1pm, and in place by 7pm on Wednesday, July 26th.

Exceptions are junior, open and senior flowers, which must be in place by 6pm Wednesday.

Each entry will have an entry tag. You can pick up your entry tags at the Administration Building starting at 12:30pm Wednesday, and attach the entry tag to exhibits before you bring them to be judged.

All entries MUST stay in place until 4:30pm on Sunday, July 30th. NO EXCEPTIONS!!!

GUIDELINES FOR YOUTH WORKING IN THE FOOD

Youth should be twelve years old to work in the food stand.

Youth under twelve can work in the food stand, but need to have adult supervision.

Adults are needed at all shifts to help with certain jobs and to supervise all youth.

Everyone young and old MUST bring a CLEAN cap or visor to wear working the 4-H Food Stand. Exceptions are individuals able to tie all hair back including bangs. Thank you ahead of time for your cooperation

PROJECT MEMBERS: This years Pre-Fair Dog Show will be scheduled for Saturday, July 15th

Agility – judging beginning at 8:00 a.m. **Obedience** - judging beginning at 10:00 a.m.

Showmanship – judging beginning approximately 11:00 a.m. (after agility is complete)

Rally – judging beginning approximately 1:00 p.m. (after obedience is complete)



The project is for migratory birds, so the birdhouses should be for those. Although there are many plans for standard birdhouses, we think it would be fun to use some creativity in designing and building them. The plan is to display them at the Fair at a booth just for the project, and then put them up on the fairgrounds.

We would like to have the birdhouses brought to the fair on Wednesday of fair week and will give the club the \$20s at that time.

We are also sponsoring a contest for creative bird watering stations that will be placed in flower beds at the fairgrounds. That is open to clubs and individuals. The idea is to have bird watering "sculptures" that double as art and be functional. And they might be related to the fair areas they will be placed. For example in the cow barn area, we might see this type of waterer (found on Pinterest-- made of cow barn watering cups).

So, any kind of birdhouse you want to make with a clamp on the back so it could be connected to a steel fence post. Your club name should be on the house so you can get recognition for your effort. And if you want to make more than one, that is fine, as the fairgrounds is 68 acres and has room for many!

- 12-13 year olds operating tractors or self-propelled implements on public roads under direction of their parent or guardian or for work related to their family farm operation
- 14-15 year olds who will be employed (or working without pay) by farms not operated by their parents/family.

Youth will learn:

- Safe Tractor and Implement Operation and Farm Safety Techniques including identifying potentially hazardous situations and how to reduce risk of injury
- Tractor instruments, controls, maintenance and safety inspections of tractors.
- Proper use and operation of tractors and tractor limitations.


Certification Requirements


- Eligible students must be 12 years old or older prior to the beginning of the course.
- Attend 24 hours of instructional training
- Pass written examination with a minimum score of 70%
- Pass a practical driving examination demonstrating safe operation of tractor and 2 wheel implement through obstacle course


