

BECOME A 4-H VOLUNTEER!

Volunteers help make 4-H possible.

To volunteer, you don't need to have previous experience working with youth. The most important qualifications are:

•a desire to work with young people to help them learn new things and gain life skills; and

•wanting to provide youth with positive experiences in a safe and welcoming environment.

If you are 18 years or older and interested in becoming a 4-H volunteer, we can help. We will provide new volunteers with <u>Volunteers in Preparation Training</u> about how to work effectively with youth and what resources are available to volunteers. We will also ask you to participate in a <u>Mandated Reporter Training</u> to learn more about how to protect youth from child abuse and neglect. Finally, to ensure the safety of all youth and volunteers, a <u>Volunteer Behavior Expectations Agreement</u> and background check are required.

Depending on their role, some volunteers may be asked to complete subject matter specific trainings as well as training to enrich their knowledge of youth development (for example chaperones or Shooting Sports leaders).

All volunteers, both new and returning, are also required to take training on how to report sexual misconduct. Answers to questions about reporting and training are available on our FAQ page.
