Become A 4-H Volunteer!

To volunteer, you don't need to have previous experience working with youth. The most important qualifications are:

- •a desire to work with young people to help them learn new things and gain life skills; and
- •wanting to provide youth with positive experiences in a safe and welcoming environment.

If you are 18 years or older and interested in becoming a 4-H volunteer, we can help. We will provide new volunteers with <u>Volunteers in Preparation Training</u> about how to work effectively with youth and what resources are available to volunteers. We will also ask you to participate in a <u>Mandated Reporter Training</u> to learn more about how to protect youth from child abuse and neglect. Finally, to ensure the safety of all youth and volunteers, a <u>Volunteer Behavior Expectations Agreement</u> and background check are required.

Depending on their role, some volunteers may be asked to complete subject matter specific trainings as well as training to enrich their knowledge of youth development (for example chaperones or Shooting Sports leaders).

All volunteers, both new and returning, are also required to take training on how to report sexual misconduct. Answers to questions about reporting and training are available on our FAQ page. For more information on becoming a volunteer please contact Lindsay Spindler, Lindsay.spindler@wisc.edu

VIP Trainings will now be done online through UW Madison Division of Extension. This is an interactive training program that will include roles and responsibilities, resources and online Zoom trainings.

4-H Trip Opportunities & the 4-H Key Award

Advanced Space Camp (Grades 9-12) Every other year in January for a week. So look for application in July 2024 for Travel in 2025. Registration is typically open in July of the year before the program through 4-H online. Cost is approximately \$2000.00 / youth.

Space Camp: April 18-22, 2024 (Grades 6-8, maximum age of 15 at time of trip.) May only attend Space Camp once as a delegate. Wisconsin 4-H Space Camp is an educational experience where youth from across the state take a bus down to Huntsville, Alabama, for a 4 day journey. Cost is approximately \$900. This includes coach bus travel and participation fees at Space Camp. Registration will be open from November 15-December 15 prior to program year through 4-H online. Wisconsin 4-H Space Camp participants experience the Pathfinder Program. The Pathfinder Program is a 3 day experience where youth participate in a variety of simulated space activities, such as: A Simulated Space Mission (including roles at mission control), A variety of Space Simulators such as the multi-axis trainer, five degrees of freedom chair, and the space shot, Building and launching their own model rocket On-site meals and sleeping habitats simulating a real space training experience, A team quiz bowl where participants test their knowledge against others at the end of camp, Tour the U.S. Space & Rocket Center

American Spirit East: June 14-23, June 21-30 or July 5-15, 2024 (Grades 8-10 (Youth in 11th grade eligible for 2023 dates based on circumstance of passed missed opportunity.) Pre-Registration in 4-H Online 2.0 is open starting October 1-November 15, 2023 through 4-H Online. Each experience is limited to 44 youth, decisions about who is selected to travel are based on the following factors: first-come-first-serve registrants, # of youth per experience, full rooms by identified gender, ages of youth traveling together, eligibility to participate in future years. Cost is approximately \$1,650. Youth will experience history & heritage by immersing in a 10-day bus journey to the East Coast — Youth-led content throughout the experience — Increase knowledge of American history while experiencing where it occurred.

Citizenship Washington Focus 2024 (CWF)—1 week trip (dates in late June still to be confirmed):. (Grades 10th-12th at selection; minimum age 15 during experience.) May only attend CWF once. Cost is approximately \$1,750. Delegates will: learn the importance of civic and social responsibilities relating to the development of better citizens and leaders, be inspired by speakers, participate in workshops, committee work, field trips and social events. Registration will open December 1 – January 10 through 4-H Online.

National 4-H Conference: April 19-24, 2024 (Grades 10-12 during the program. Minimum age 15 and maximum age 18 as of January 1, year of travel.) National 4-H Conference annually brings 4-H youth and adults from around the nation to work towards strengthening and expanding the 4-H Youth Development program at the local, state, and national levels. National 4-H Conference is the U.S. Secretary of Agriculture's premier youth development opportunity to engage youth in developing recommendations for the 4-H Youth Development Program. In 2019, there were approximately 350 delegates, including *seven* from Wisconsin. Generally between 6-10 youth from Wisconsin are selected to attend this working Conference. Cost is approximately \$1,500. (If a youth applies to And is selected by the Awards Committee the fee will be covered by the Polk Co. 4-H Leaders Federation.) *October 2023 – Applications available for National 4-H Conference through 4h.extension.wisc.edu. Due by January 2, 2024 – State applications, complete with signatures, to the State 4-H Office.

State Teams (Drama Team, Art Team, YLC): Planning Weekend (April possibly 5-7) & 9-day, 8-night Conference week in Madison (June 2024). (Grades 9-13 at the time of application.) Registration open October 15 due by November 1, 2023 for early applications and January 15, 2023 for the final application deadline through 4-H Online. Youth will: Develop leadership and life skills through the arts, have the opportunity to work and share ideas with a team of youth and adults that is committed to quality, have the opportunity to work in the UW-Madison campus setting, advance skills in a wide variety of artistic disciplines. Cost is\$700 which includes all expenses (meals and lodging) for a three-day, two-night 4-H Spring Planning Weekend (April) and 9-day, 8 -night programming week in Madison (June 2024).

National 4-H Congress: November 29-December 3, 2024 (Grades 9-12 at registration; maximum age 18 as of January 1, of the year of travel. *Youth can attend National Congress only once as a delegate*. National 4-H Congress is a five-day Educational Experience held in Atlanta, GA. Congress is the premiere nation-wide event for 4-Hers to network with others from around the country, Canada, and Puerto Rico. While at Congress, 4-Hers engage in leadership, citizenship, global awareness, and inclusion. Here are just some of the activities delegates will partake in while at National Congress: Educational workshops, Explore the city, State and Congress-wide meetings, International Events- night of international dinner and entertainment, Community Service, Educational Tours, World-Renowned speakers, National 4-H Congress Gala. Cost is approximately \$1,200. (If a youth applies to And is selected by the Awards Committee the fee will be covered by the Polk Co. 4-H Leaders Federation.) Registration is June 1 – July 1 2024 through 4H online.

Summer Academy: 3 days **June** (probably 3 week) 2024 (Grades 7 – 11) This positive youth development program on UW Madison Campus will help you discover the pathways to your future. Sign up for workshops in the morning and in the afternoon. There will be fun opportunities to try new things and make friendships with youth from all over the State of WI. **Cost TBD. Registration should open in March through** 4-H online.

4-H Key Award: The Wisconsin 4-H Key Award Program is one of the highest recognitions a 4-H member can receive. This award recognizes a select group of 4-H participants who have demonstrated consistent growth in their 4-H involvement, developed and applied their leadership skills, and actively participated in the functions of their 4-H club and community. To be eligible, candidates for this award must be at least in **9th grade or older**, and must have completed at least three years of 4-H and one year of youth leadership. **Application form is available through Polk County 4-H office and is Due to the office with your M.E. Form by January 1st.**

4-H International Trip Opportunities for Summer 2024: Japan = 4 week and 8 week options, South Korea = 4 week, Costa Rica = 4 week, Taiwan = 4 week, Norway = 4 week (possibly available 2024) (Argentina = 4 week, Romania = 4 week = TBD for 2024 yet). Application forms available through 4h.extension.wisc.edu/opportunities travel abroad, Applications Due December 15th.


