The 4-H American Spirit Experience offers youth in grades 8-10 a 10-day bus journey to the East Coast and Canada, focusing on American history and heritage. Participants lead content while visiting significant sites, gaining exposure to diverse cultures.

The program emphasizes career readiness, leadership development, and experiential learning in history and civics, highlighting diversity and the challenges faced by various groups. Additionally, it fosters positive relationships among participants and adults from across the state.



Applications for the program are open from November 1-30, 2025, via 4HOnline. Youth must be in grades 8th-10th when registring. Additional details about American Spirit and orientation will follow registration. Payment is due by mid-April 2026.




